WATERLOO EXTENSION PROJECT UPDATE




Waterloo Wind Farm is being extended, with the addition of six new Vestas V117 turbines immediately south of the existing 37 turbine wind farm.

New turbines will be spaced at intervals similar to existing turbines, extending the length of the wind farm by three kilometres towards Marrabel. Substantial time had gone into preparing our plans so that they will meet the expectations of Council and the wider community.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?



Employment

It is expected that around **130 people will be employed** during construction, many from the local area.



Local community

The project team estimates **\$2.3 million** of the overall budget will flow directly to the local community during the construction phase.



Clean energy

When the extension is complete, the total capacity of Waterloo will be over **130 megawatts (MW)** a year - enough clean energy to supply over 59,000 homes and businesses.

Why is Waterloo being extended? Can I provide feedback?

The location of the Waterloo Wind Farm is ideal for generating high volumes of energy from natural wind resources present in the region.

Additional turbines at Waterloo were always envisaged as a part of the original development project.

Now, after five years of solid performance from the wind farm, we will build additional turbines to increase the amount of clean energy the wind farm can produce.

By adding to the existing wind farm – and using infrastructure already in place - we will gain more clean energy with less impact on the community and the environment.

Who is managing this project?

Construction of the Waterloo Wind Farm extension will be managed by a specialist team with support from EnergyAustralia staff.

Palisade and Northleaf Capital, Waterloo's joint-owners, will fund the \$43 million construction project.

During construction, the existing wind farm will continue to be run by the staff onsite who will also be available to respond to queries from the community.

Yes. Community consultation plays an important role in helping us manage our wind farm and allows us to keep neighbours and residents updated with relevant information.
